Financial market events


USA:

- **Positive:** USA continues to recover from the decline in financial markets, which has been affected by the worldwide spread of virus COVID-19.
- **Negative:** the virus still seriously affects the USA economy and illness/mortality rates are very high. The USA stock index trends are currently volatile and respond very quickly to any virus-related news.
 - Tensions continue between the USA and China, and the rhetoric of the USA President is creating tensions with other partners, such as NATO and the World Health Organization.
- **Conclusion:** although the performance of the strategy funds declined in March this year, there is a rapid recovery.
- **Future view:** managers will closely monitor virus containment measures, the USA economy, the USA Federal Reserve's monetary policy and the presidential election campaign.

Europe:

- **Positive:** Europe is also continuing to recover from the downturn in financial markets. Stock indices are growing more slowly than in the US, but there is a positive trend. Furthermore, more and more countries are reducing virus control measures.
- **Negative:** the prevalence of the virus remains high in some countries, and Europe is not united in limiting the effects of the virus, in particular in promoting economic recovery. Brexit is a question still unsolved.
- **Conclusion:** although the results of the strategy funds fell in March this year, there is a rapid recovery.
- **Future view:** managers will continue to monitor virus containment as well as economic growth across Europe. Further announcements by the European Central Bank on interest rates and changes in monetary policy are expected.


